

University Animal Care Committee (UACC) Procedures on Adoption of University Animals Used in Research and Teaching

Purpose

Identify formal procedures regarding the process to adopt animals used in research, teaching and production at the University of Saskatchewan (USask). USask animals with no significant health concerns may undergo adoption as companion animals. Suitability of USask animals for adoption is at the discretion of the UACC Veterinarians.

Background

The UACC exercises the option to implement a formal adoption process for any animal used in research, teaching, and production that has reached its non-terminal experimental endpoint or is no longer appropriate for use as defined in an UACC approved animal use protocol (AUP). The Office of the Vice-President Research (OVPR) supports the option for adoption in accordance with applicable institutional and national regulations.

Responsibility

- 1. The UACC Facility Veterinarian to assess the health status of the animal up for adoption.
- 2. The Facility Manager and UACC Facility Veterinarian to identify potential behaviour or health related concerns regarding the animal up for adoption.
- **3.** The principal investigator/course director to provide information on all manipulations and interventions applied to the animal up for adoption.
- 4. The principal investigator, Facility Manager, UACC Facility Veterinarian, and animal care staff to seek a potential home for the animal up for adoption.

Procedure

This procedure document outlines the process for adoption of university animals as companion animals only. A companion animal is defined as any animal kept solely as a personal pet and not for other purposes.

The procedure for adoption must consider eligibility, adoption procedure, and transfer of ownership.

I. ADOPTION ELIGIBILITY

- a. Animals in good health and with appropriate behaviours may undergo adoption. Animals with underlying health conditions or behavioural concerns will be assessed by the Facility Veterinarian; any conditions/concerns will be discussed with the potential adopter who will agree to the adoption of the animal with these identified conditions and will agree to pay for any necessary treatment.
 - Information about the experimental procedures or interventions that might result in persistent health concerns must be made available to the UACC Facility Veterinarian for assessment and to the potential adopter for their reference.
 - The UACC Facility Veterinarian will conduct a physical examination to determine the clinical health and disposition of the animal.
 - The animal must not be actively involved in an UACC approved animal use protocol.
- b. The Principal Investigator and the UACC Facility Veterinarian must approve the adoption of animals deemed in good health and with acceptable behaviour. Exceptions may be made, on a case-by-case basis, at the discretion of the UACC Facility Veterinarian.
- c. The adopter must agree to adopt the animal as a companion animal only, i.e., must not sell or use as food (for human or animal consumption). Furthermore, the adopter must agree to be solely responsible for veterinary care and behavioural management at the time of 'Transfer of Ownership'.
- d. The adopter must agree with the assessment of health of the animal and is responsible for all future veterinary care at the time of the 'Transfer of Ownership'. If applicable, the adopter must agree to have the animal spayed or neutered prior to its acquisition.
- e. Animals not eligible for adoption include:
 - Reproductively intact (exceptions for large animals based on the UACC Facility Veterinarian discretion)
 - Genetically engineered (transgenic) animals
 - Animals exposed to infectious agents
 - Animals considered a potential invasive species or endangered species
 - Animals on a restricted wildlife permit

• Animals for which the Principal Investigator, Facility Veterinarian, and/or Facility Manager identifies any issues or risk that excludes them from adoption

II. ADOPTION PROCEDURE

- a. Veterinary Examination
 - A UACC Facility Veterinarian reviews the research protocol and animal's clinical record to understand the animal's suitability for adoption as identified in the 'Adoption Eligibility' above.
- b. Identification of Prospective Owner
 - The UACC or other members of USask will advertise available animals internally to the animal care and use program (including external, UACC-affiliated organizations). Advertising through internal, USask managed listservs may be approved by the UACC in some cases. Advertising to the general public in any form, including but not limited; to posted flyers, online advertisements (i.e. Kijiji, craigslist, etc.), social media sites (i.e. Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, etc.), holding of animals for viewing, advertising with local shelters, etc. is not allowed.
 - The Principal Investigator/Course Directors, Facility Veterinarian, Facility Manager, and animal care staff are allowed to identify a prospective adopter.
 - The UACC Facility Veterinarian and/or Facility Manager interviews the prospective adopter to determine their reasons for adoption and the adopter's willingness and ability to provide for the animal's welfare, assess their suitability and knowledge of appropriate care required for the animal, and address questions the adopter may have regarding the animal.
 - The UACC Facility Veterinarian must identify to the prospective adopter any potential health/behavioural concerns that might arise from the teaching or research use.
 - The UACC Facility Veterinarian and/or Facility Manager interview the prospective adopter to determine reasons for adoption and the adopter's willingness and ability to provide for the animal's welfare, and address questions the adopter may have regarding the animal.
 - The interview will cover specific questions including: prospective residence, other pets at the residence and their health status, children at the residence and their ages, and experience with having pets. The interview will also establish the prospective owner's expectations for the animal they are adopting and suitability of the animal as a pet.
 - The UACC Facility Veterinarian or Facility Manager completes a 'Companion Animal Transfer Agreement' form. The owner receives the original form, the UACC maintains a copy of the original in electronic format in the AUP file and in a separate adoption of animal's file.

III. TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

- a. The adopter completes an 'Animal Adoption Agreement'. A signed agreement is copied and the adopter receives the original copy; the UACC maintains an electronic copy in the animal use protocol file and in a separate adoption animal file.
- b. Once a signed copy is available to the UACC, the owner may leave the facility with the adopted animal. Once in the full possession of the new owner, USask assumes no further responsibility for the animal or any health care or behavioural issues. A follow-up communication will occur between the Facility Veterinarian and the adopter at regular intervals during the first two months of adoption to facilitate a smooth transition. If severe issues are identified which preclude the adopter from being able to maintain the animal at their residence, alternative arrangements will be identified including potential of previously identified and approved foster care or return to the USask animal facility.

The University makes no representation or warranty that this animal is not infected with zoonotic diseases.

The above-named party agrees to accept the animal "as is" and shall be solely responsible for the animal from the date hereof.
