Insight Development Grant (IDG)

Objectives:

- To support research in its *initial stages* conducted by emerging and/or established scholars
- To enable the development of *new research questions*, as well as *experimentation* with new methods, theoretical approaches, and/or ideas
 - may include case studies, pilot initiatives, and critical analyses of existing research



IDG Basic Features

- **Applicant:** Principal investigator alone or with a team
- **Duration:** 1 to 2 years
- **Value:** \$7,000 to \$75,000
- **CV:** Canadian Common CV (CCV)
- **Evaluation:** by committee and all are multidisciplinary
- **Application process:** one-step application through the Research Portal (and Canadian Common CV)

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Is this the Right Grant for You?

INSIGHT

- projects from 3–5 years
- any stage of research
- \$7,000 to \$400,000
- all researchers evaluated equally

INSIGHT DEVELOPMENT

- projects from 1–2 years
- initial stage of research
- \$7,000 to \$75,000
- *emerging* scholars evaluated separately from *established* researchers

NOTE:

- PIs cannot apply for an IG and an IDG in the same calendar year



Emerging vs Established Scholars

Emerging	<p>Eligibility:</p>	<p>Research:</p>
	<p>Cannot hold previous Tri-Agency operating funding (except Connections funding)</p> <p>Must meet at least one of the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • completed highest degree no more than 6 years before the competition deadline or • held a tenured/tenure-track appointment for < 6 years or • held a university appointment, but never a tenure-track position or • had career significantly interrupted or delayed for family reasons 	<p>Grants are <i>developmental</i> as they offer emerging scholars a chance to develop their career</p> <p>Research can, but need not be, wholly new; i.e. extension of PhD research is OK</p>
Established	<p>Eligibility:</p>	<p>Research:</p>
	<p>Someone who has established—or who, since the completion of his or her highest degree, has had the opportunity to establish a record of research achievement (includes any identifiable contributions made to the advancement, development and mobilization of knowledge related to the disciplines supported by SSHRC)</p>	<p>Grants are for work in new areas, in new ways, to do pilot studies, etc., without being penalized for lack of experience in the new area</p>

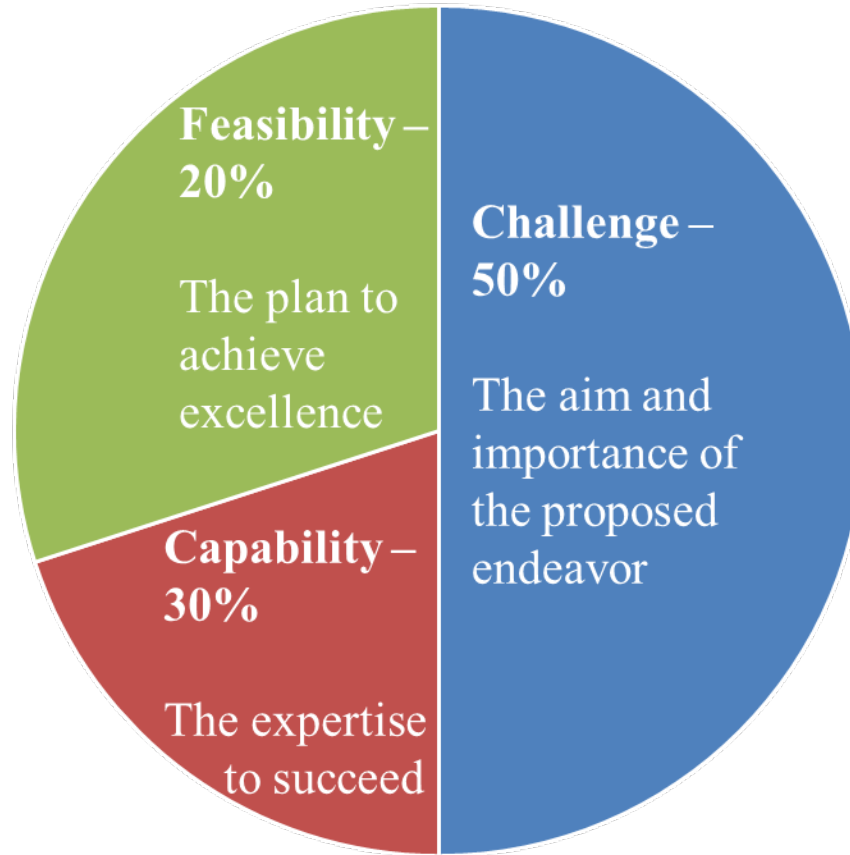

If there you will find a template with all the sections and appropriate headings to help you develop your application. The examples (maximum 1.5 pages) and font (Times New Roman, 12 pt) have been adjusted for you in this word document to maintain your space and still be within SSHRC's guidelines. [Your application may be declined and resubmitted if you fail to adhere to our guidelines.]

Once you are ready to complete the online application, you will need to:

1. cut and paste the information from the first 8 sections (up to the budget/justification) into the application form and
2. make the first 6 items readable into separate pdf attachments that will have to be uploaded into the application form.

NOTE: Each section in the template below includes some very brief instructions/guidelines in square brackets; be sure to follow them before you submit your grant.
