Amplified CIHR Internal Review Program for CIHR Project Grant

June, 2023

Internal Review Procedures:

- CIHR Notice of Intent (NOI) requested 4 times per year
 - NOIs from prospective applicants will be invited 4 times a year (March, June, September, and December).
 - NOI's should be submitted 6 to 18 months of the anticipated application submission deadline. Applicants submitting an NOI 18 months prior to the expected application date will receive support throughout the process. Applicants who prefer less support should submit 6 months prior so a traditional internal review can be provided.
 - (Example for year 2024 is provide in Table 1 below) as follows:

Table1: NOI submission timelines for 2024

• Applicants will be required to identify the specific competition (Fall/ Spring and Year) to which they intend to submit. The target date may change as the review process progresses

Strategic Grant Advisors and Grant Advisory Team

- OVPR (Tri council Team for CIHR) will recruit a pool of Strategic Grant Advisors (CIHR grant holder, CIHR review committee, etc.)
- Each NOI participating in Amplified Internal Review will be assigned a Strategic Grant Advisor
- Grant Advisory Team comprising of Strategic Grant Advisor, applicant's Associate/Vice Dean Research and Research Facilitator will provide the necessary research facilitation support for the application.
- After reviewing the NOI application from OVPR, the Strategic Grant Advisor may:
 - Agree to work with the applicant (either alone or with another grant advisor)
 - Refer the application to another researcher (may be external to the USask) ; OR

• Decline this application (e.g. if the anticipated contribution to the application is low)

Support provided by Strategic Grant Advisor

- Support provided by strategic grant advisors will vary depending on the NOI and the timeline. However, it is expected that strategic grant advisors work with the applicant during the entire period leading up to (and perhaps following) submission of the application to CIHR.
- No limits to the activities of the Strategic Grant Advisors, given consent of the applicant is received.
- Applicants may decide to discontinue the grant advisor's assistance after an initial review OR grant-advisors may be invited to become co-applicants if their contribution is deemed significant.
- The PI will retain full authority over all decisions and visioning for the application.

<u>Grants due < 6 months</u>

- A minimum of 1 peer review using same process currently employed at USask.
- Additional support may not be required OR may not be feasible given timeline

Grants due between 6 and 18 months

- Support is individualized to applicant; however, the recommended process includes:
 - Initial face to face meeting to discuss application
 - Establishment of a timeline for application development and submission
 - Reviews occur in sections as they are completed
