USask Library Research Support



New Frontiers in Research Fund – Exploration Stream

The objective of the <u>NFRF Exploration</u> stream is to support high-risk, high-reward, and interdisciplinary research. It seeks to inspire projects that bring disciplines together beyond traditional disciplinary or common interdisciplinary approaches by research teams with the capacity to explore something new that might fail, but that has the potential for significant impact.

A proportion of awards equal to the proportion of applications submitted that are led by <u>early career researchers</u> will be reserved for early career researchers.

Funds Available: Up to \$125,000 (including indirect costs) per year for up to 2 years

Notice of Intent Deadline: August 27, 2024 (8:00 PM Eastern) **Full Application Deadline:** November 5, 2024 (8:00 PM Eastern)

Alfred P. Sloan Foundation – Sloan Research Fellowships

The <u>Sloan Research Fellowships</u> are two-year \$75,000 fellowships are awarded annually to early-career researchers whose creativity, innovation, and research accomplishments make them stand out as the next generation of leaders. Candidates must hold a PhD or equivalent degree in chemistry, computer science, Earth system science, economics, mathematics, neuroscience, physics, or a related field and they must be tenure-track, though untenured, as of September 15 of the nomination year.

Funds Available: \$75,000

Nomination Deadline: September 15, 2024

Canadian Institutes of Health Research – Team Grant: Healthy Youth (2024)

Building on almost a decade of federal investment in youth health and well-being, the purpose of the **Healthy Youth (2024)** funding opportunity is to support research teams that bring evidence to at least two of the six youth-identified priorities of <u>Canada's Youth Policy</u> to inform meaningful change that improves youth health and well-being.

Research teams must include an Early Career Researcher or a Mid-career Researcher in a Principal Role.

Funds Available: Up to \$300,000 per year for up to 5 years, or a total of \$1,500,000

Registration Deadline: December 10, 2024 Full Application Deadline: February 4, 2025

Parkinson Canada – 2025 New Investigator Award

Parkinson Canada's mission is to transform the lives of people living with Parkinson's across Canada. The <u>New Investigator Award Program</u> is a project grant to encourage and support early career researchers in the field of Parkinson's Disease who were appointed to their first faculty position within the last 5 years. The program offers awards for the support of projects with budgets of up to \$45,000 per year over a three-year term to exceptional applicants who have been approved for funding.

Funds Available: Up to \$45,000 annually for 3 years Application Deadline: November 1, 2024 (5:00 PM EST)

Alzheimer Society Canada - New Investigator Operating Grant

The Alzheimer Society Research Program offers funding to innovating researchers working on vital studies about dementia. The **New Investigator Operating Grant** is designed to help launch the careers of outstanding researchers who are within the first 6 years of their initial academic appointment. Operating grants of up to \$200,000 for up to 4 years are available.

Funds Available: Up to \$200,000 for up to 4 years Registration Deadline: November 4, 2025 (5:00 PM ET)
