NSERC CREATE: Mandatory Internal Review Process and Deadlines

The <u>NSERC CREATE</u> program supports the training and mentoring of teams of highly qualified students and postdoctoral fellows from Canada and abroad. The aim of the program is to develop innovative training programs that foster professional skills and improve job readiness for careers in industry, government, nongovernmental organizations, or the academy.

The **deadline to submit a CREATE letter of intent to NSERC is 01 May 2023**. For those who are planning to apply to the CREATE program for this year, please be aware of that because NSERC limits the number of applications each institution can submit, there will be a *mandatory peer review process* for applications this year.

If you wish to apply for the CREATE this year, please submit a draft of your 5-page letter of intent by **24 March 2023** to rasis.support@usask.ca. Instructions for the LOI are available on the NSERC website here.

All submitted proposals will be reviewed by a panel of CREATE holders who will also provide feedback to strengthen your application. Decisions will be communicated by 01 April 2023.

The Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) <u>John R. Evans Leaders Fund (JELF)</u> is a program to provide institutions the opportunity to acquire infrastructure for leading research faculty to undertake cutting-edge research. USask has been provided a JELF institutional envelope from which **project leaders can request up to 40% of the eligible project costs**. USask regularly participates in the February and October JELF submissions to the CFI.

UK Research and Innovation (UKRI): Global Centres in Clean Energy and Climate Change

Global Centres in Clean Energy and Climate Change supports new cutting-edge, interdisciplinary, use-inspired research on clean energy and climate change through international partnerships fostering novel breakthroughs or informing policy. UKRI funding for this opportunity will be utilised to create an ecosystem of global centres which thrive on international partnership. Specifically, funding is available for UK based researchers to create partnerships which must contain a partner in the US and could also include partners in Canada or Australia.

Note: USask researchers need to partner with UK based colleagues to apply for funding.

NSF submission deadline: 10 May 2023

UKRI submission deadline: 11 May 2023 4pm (UK time)

Total Fund: £22,500,000 **Maximum Award:** £6,250,000

Spencer Foundation: Research Grants on Education - Small

The <u>Small Research Grants Program</u> supports education research projects that will contribute to the improvement of education, broadly conceived, with budgets up to \$50,000 for projects ranging from one to five years. The foundation accepts applications three times per year (April, August, & December). This program is "field-initiated" in that proposal submissions are not in response to a specific request for a particular research topic, discipline, design, method, or location.

Budget: \$50,000 USD

Full Proposal Deadlines: 05 April 2023 (12pm Central Time) **Internal Deadline:** two weeks prior to the external deadline

Spencer Foundation: Research Grants on Education - Large

The <u>Large Research Grants on Education Program</u> supports education research projects that will contribute to the improvement of education, broadly conceived, with budgets ranging from \$125,000 to \$500,000 for projects ranging from one to five years. This program is "field-initiated" in that proposal submissions are not in response to a specific request for a particular research topic, discipline, design, method, or location. The goal for this program is to support rigorous, intellectually ambitious and technically sound research that is relevant to the most pressing questions and compelling opportunities in education.

Budget Ranges: \$125,000 to 250,000; \$250,001 to \$375,000; and \$375,001 to \$500,000 USD

Intent to Apply: 27 April 2023 (12pm noon Central time)

Full Proposal Deadline: 24 May 2023 (12pm noon Central time)

QuantERA Call 2023

The National Science Centre (NCN) of Poland, in collaboration with QuantERA II ERA-Net Cofund, hereby announces the **QuantERA Call 2023** for international research projects in quantum technologies covering: Quantum Phenomena and Resources and Applied Quantum Science. Funding proposals may be submitted by international consortia composed of at least 3 research teams from at least 3 countries participating in the call. The principal investigator of the Polish research team must hold at least a PhD degree.

Note: USask researchers need to partner with their Polish colleagues to apply for funding.

US Department of Defense Autism Research Program (ARP)

<u>US Department of Defense Autism Research Program (ARP)</u> opens three (3) funding opportunities within the call: (1) Career Development Award; (2) Clinical Trial Award; and (3) Idea Development Award. Interested applicants are encouraged to contact <u>international.office@usask.ca</u> to discuss your application and institutional information needed for the submission.

US NIH Genomic Community Resources

Awards under this call will support the development and distribution of high-value genomic resources valuable for both basic and clinical genomics research. This open sharing is essential for exploring the genome and its role in health and disease. Genomic community resources are key mechanisms for this open

sharing, enabling researchers to perform their research, to compare methods, and to integrate multiple data types with genomic information. National Human Genome Research Institute (NHGRI) currently supports numerous genomic resources so they can be widely available to the research community. Interested applicants are encouraged to contact international.office@usask.ca as soon as possible to discuss your application and institutional information needed for the submission.

Available funding: Application budgets are not limited but need to reflect the actual needs of the proposed project. Applicants requesting \$500,000 or more in direct costs in any year must contact an NIH Scientific/ Research Officer at least 6 weeks before submitting the application and follow the Policy on the Acceptance for Review of Unsolicited Applications that Request \$500,000 or More in Direct Costs as described in the SF424 (R&R) Application Guide.

US NIH Translational Research in Maternal and Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics

Two (2) calls are offered under Translational Research in Maternal and Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics. The goal of translational research is to transform basic science and clinical research discoveries into results that have direct clinical and health impact. Novel tools, methodologies, and other resources are essential to accelerate the translational process, particularly when they are of broad applicability to the scientific and clinical communities who work with pregnant persons, lactating persons, and children, including those with physical or intellectual disabilities. Interested applicants are encouraged to contact international.office@usask.ca as soon as possible to discuss your application and institutional information needed for the submission.

A. <u>Translational Research in Maternal and Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics</u> (R01 Clinical Trial Optional)

B. <u>Translational Research in Maternal and Pediatric Pharmacology and Therapeutics</u> (R21 Clinical Trial Optional).

Available funding: The combined budget for direct costs for the two-year project period may not exceed \$275,000.
