Commonwealth Peace and Reconciliation Challenge Grants are aimed at academic and professional staff at <u>ACU member universities</u>, and the grants can be used to support initiatives advancing peace, reconciliation, and indigenous knowledge. Four grants of up to **GBP2,500 each**, will be available for ACU members to meet the costs of organising projects that promote the aims and priorities of the Commonwealth Peace and Reconciliation Network. Canada-Brain Canada Trainee Program 2023

Brain Canada and ALS Canada share a strong belief that it is crucial that promising young investigators are nurtured in the early stages of their careers so they can strive to promote discovery and advancement.

The intent for the <u>ALS Canada-Brain Canada Trainee Program</u> is to attract the brightest young minds to ALS research, which will contribute to a succession plan for the Canadian ALS research community. This program is designed to nurture and support innovative ideas and compelling breakthroughs across the spectrum of ALS research.

A \$315,000 pool of funds will be available for this program. Each **Doctoral Award would be funded at \$25,000 per year for up to three years**, and each **Postdoctoral Fellowship would be funded at \$55,000 per year for up to three years**. The funds awarded through this fellowship will be utilized to support the stipend/salary of the awardee(s).

Evidence clearly shows that increasing equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) in research environments enhances excellence, innovation, and creativity. Brain Canada is committed to excellence through equity, and we encourage applicants of diverse backgrounds to apply to our funding opportunities, which will promote the expression of diverse perspectives, approaches, and experiences, including those of underrepresented groups.

Canada Launches New Small Modular Reactor Funding Program

NRCan announced a call for proposals for its **Enabling Small Modular Reactor Program**. The new program will provide **\$29.6 million over four years** to:

- Develop supply chains for SMR manufacturing and fuel supply and security to support the crucial elements necessary for Canada's SMR industry to thrive; and
- Fund research on safe SMR waste management solutions to ensure that SMRs, and the waste they generate, will be safe now and into the future.

Eligible applicants include private companies, utilities, provinces and territories, universities and Indigenous groups.

This program is complementary to the NSERC-NRCan Alliance grant that is also currently accepting Expressions of Interest but is open to a broader audience.
