2027 Innovation Fund (IF) - Information Session

The Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) will announce the 2027 Innovation Fund (IF) program. The Innovation Fund aims to enhance infrastructure and personnel capacity, enabling researchers to stay at the forefront of exploration and knowledge creation. The CFI IF program supports the development of large-scale, distinctive, and advanced facilities that can boost future research in your field for many years.

Through this competition, CFI will invest up to approximately \$280 million in infrastructure and cover up to 40% of the project's eligible costs. CFI will also allocate up to roughly \$84 million for related operating and maintenance expenses through the Infrastructure Operating Fund (IOF). The most common eligible costs include renovation or construction expenses, research equipment, and personnel to support the development or use of the infrastructure.

RASI will hold an information session on October 29th, 2025, focused on developing competitive IF applications. The workshop will also explain USask's internal processes for distributing our CFI IF institutional funds and outline the support available for teams applying for this opportunity. France Canada Research Funds 2026 - Call for Applications

The <u>France Canada Research Fund (FCRF)</u> 2026 call for proposals is open to any research field and incentivizes interdisciplinarity. The FCRF aims to accomplish the following objectives:

- Support the development of new research partnerships between France and Canada;
- Promote the advancement of research and innovation;
- Prepare and structure scientific cooperation between the two countries;
- Promote researchers' mobility, particularly for early career researchers;
- Provide research training for researchers at the master's and doctorate levels.

Eligibility:

- Applications must come from principal investigators (PIs), both from research institutions located in France and Canada.
- The FCRF endorses **new research collaboration** between PIs who have never obtained a research joint funding prior this application. Exceptions may be granted for researchers who previously collaborated during their PhD or during a post-doctoral contract.
- PIs must meet all the following criteria:
 - o Must hold a tenure or a tenure track position;
 - FRANCE: Be affiliated with higher education institutions or public research organizations (please contact <u>international.office@usask.ca</u> to confirm whether your partner institution meets this eligibility criterion);
 - o CANADA: Affiliated to one of the 23 Canadian universities who are members of the FCRF consortium, including USask.

Step 1: **Please** submit your application via UnivRS and inform the USask International Office at international.office@usask.ca with the subject line "FCRF submission" **before 14 November 2025 at 11:59 pm (PST)** for the pre-selection. USask can pre-select up to 5 applications.

Step 2: If your application is pre-selected at USask, it will be submitted to the French Embassy in Canada before 19 December 2025 and you will be notified.

Faculty Mobility for Partnership Building Program

The Faculty Mobility for Partnership Building Program (FMPBP) provides opportunities for Canadian faculty to do short-term research and teach in Latin America and the Caribbean. The program is funded by Global Affairs Canada through the Academic Relations program to support Canada's education relations and engagement in the region by advancing institutional partnerships in the areas of research, student mobility, joint programming, and capacity building.

The primary objective of the program is to increase, diversify and strengthen institutional collaborations between Canadian post-secondary institutions and their counterparts eligible under the <u>Emerging Leaders in the Americas Program</u> (ELAP).

To be eligible,

- a candidate must be a full-time professor at a Canadian post-secondary institution

Curious about the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions (MSCA), the European Union's reference program for doctoral education and postdoctoral training? Designed in collaboration with the Embassy of Poland to the U.S., Polish MSCA National Contact Points, and EURAXESS Poland, this meeting will allow interested researchers and faculty to learn about moving to new country to carry out your research idea, or hosting such a postdoctoral fellow, respectively. Open to the public, EURAXESS North America will convene speakers to share testimonials and answer your questions on the Postdoctoral Fellowships (MSCA-PF), a mobility scheme that targets researchers holding a PhD who wish to carry out their research activities abroad, acquire new skills, and develop their careers. PFs help researchers gain experience in other countries, disciplines, and non-academic sectors.

The speakers will share information on Poland as a research destination, but the webinar is open to all, and the principles apply to all prospective applicants, regardless of which institution or country they would like to go to. Whether you are a researcher interested in a postdoc (in Europe or anywhere in the world), a faculty member who wants to recruit postdocs (paid by the EU), or an administrator who wants to understand the ins and outs of this program for your researchers, take advantage of this opportunity to connect with experts.

Academics Without Borders - Call for Project Proposals

<u>Academics Without Borders (AWB)</u> is looking to develop and support projects that enable volunteer experts to engage in capacity-building activities at institutions of higher education in low or middle-income countries (LMIC's).

This is a call for capacity-building proposals for AWB projects, not funding.

Important Considerations:

- Applications may be submitted by a faculty or staff member at one of the universities and colleges in the AWB Network in collaboration with a partner institution of higher education in a low or middle-income country.
- Sustainability of the project is key: partner institutions must have the resources to engage with the project and to ensure its sustainability once the activities of the project have ended.
- AWB engages in all stages from project conception, volunteer selection and orientation, implementation, and evaluation.
- AWB Network faculty or staff's role is as a facilitator of the development of the proposal and as a potential AWB volunteer for the implementation of the project.

- The partner institution in the low or middle-income country is involved at all steps of project development and implementation.
- AWB does not provide traditional grants it is an implementing agency, providing project management and other support, and also provides reimbursement for basic direct project costs as delineated here.

Application Process:

The process is in two stages.

- 1. Submission of a first stage application as outlined below and using the form linked below.
- 2. If the proposal meets the eligibility requirements, it moves to a second stage in which AWB contacts the partner institution and invites a more fully developed project proposal.

Friendly Reminder: CAPES-Global program – Opportunities to Collaborate with Brazilian Partners

<u>CAPES-Global</u> is CAPES (Coordenação de Aperfeiçoamento de Pessoal de Nível Superior)'s new program to support internationalization of higher education institutions (HEIs) in Brazil. The call was published on July 11th (<u>Edital do Programa CAPES Global.Edu é publicado — CAPES</u>), with an aim to build on lessons learned from previous programs and reduce regional asymmetries. The program's objective is to form networks of collaboration between Brazilian institutions (in which there will be one "coordinating institution" and 3 to 5 "associated institutions") and international HEIs. Program will foster the creation of cooperation networks among national institutions, at different stages of internationalization, with the objective of promoting, through international collaboration, the development of strategic research and graduate education activities among participating institutions.

Below are some program parameters:

- From the Brazilian side, networks will be formed by groups of 4 to 6 institutions with graduate-level programs (Please note that not all Brazilian HEIs will be eligible due to this criterion. Federal Institutes with graduate-level programs would be eligible.
- HEIs must be of different sizes, different regions in Brazil and different levels of internationalization.
- Interaction with non-academic sectors (civil society, sub-national governments): stimulate collaboration with society organisations, to enhance HEIs relevance within their contexts. This objective encompasses actions focused on teaching, research, outreach, innovation, leadership, entrepreneurship, creative economy, sustainability, and social and environmental awareness.
- Thematic networks each network must define strategic themes based on the expertise of its
 coordinating and associated institutions. Themes for collaboration must be aligned with UN's SDG
 and/or Brazil's national priorities (including the National Strategy for STI, Brazil's AI plan, the New
 Industry Brazil Plan, the National Bioeconomy Strategy, etc).
- Selected themes will guide the development of internationalization activities and collaborative projects.
- This will be a **5-year program and CAPES will fund BRL 350 million per year for the next 4 years**. Funding will be available for scholarships, missions and maintenance of international cooperation projects.
- There is not a pre-determined number of networks that will be funded MEC informed they will fund
 networks until they reach the "budget ceiling". However, it is very possible that up to 20 universities are
 selected as coordinators of the networks, meaning around 100 local universities may benefit from this
 program.
- Mid-term evaluation in the 2nd year and final evaluation, with annual monitoring.
- Networks are expected to be implemented in 2026.

• Canadian universities are invited to connect with their partners to explore opportunities to participate in these networks. International HEIs can participate in multiple networks.

Next steps:

- Brazilian universities are required to present their projects, naming the local institutions that will form their networks, by 30 October 2025. They are also required to inform, when submitting the project, with which international institutions they will collaborate under the program.
- Each network will define strategic themes aligned with Brazil's national priorities and/or the SDGs.
- Brazilian institutions will seek international partners whose expertise align with the selected strategic themes, strengthening collaboration through mutual exchange. MoUs between Brazilian and international universities should be in place by the time cooperation begins (early 2026).
- Proposals will undergo an evaluation process based on technical and merit criteria. Approved networks
 will receive funding for a period of up to five years, with funding disbursements concentrated in the first
 four years.
- The implementation phase will begin in 2026 (likely March), with research projects, mobility activities and international cooperation initiatives formally starting.

How international institutions can participate:

- International institutions from all over the world are welcome to participate.
- Networks are encouraged to build or consolidate partnerships with foreign institutions with expertise in the themes selected by the networks.
- Funded activities include: International missions to establish or implement agreements; Conference participation; Scholarships abroad (sandwich PhDs, visiting scholars junior and senior and short-term training); Scholarships in Brazil (for hosting international researchers visiting professors, postdocs, young talents); Short-duration professional development (15 days up to 3 months).
- Agreements will be established between Brazilian and international institutions to define roles, activities and collaboration commitments.
- Partnerships should be balanced, ensuring that both parties share the benefits equally.
- Foreign institution must commit to offering **fee waivers for academic internships** for Brazilian students and researchers, as Brazil does.
- The institution should demonstrate a **commitment to inclusion and diversity,** promoting equal opportunities while considering the different needs and perspectives of participants.
