The Journey From Ideas to Funding: Constructing Your SSHRC Insight Development Grant Application One Step at a Time – Part 2

As we did last year, our USask SSHRC support team will be offering a series of targeted workshops that delve deep into specific sections of the grant application. We will be hosting 2 sessions - each session will focus on areas traditionally viewed as challenging for many applicants.

During these sessions, participants are encouraged to bring drafts of their grant sections for on-the-spot feedback and revisions. You will have an opportunity to review, brainstorm ideas, and draft versions of each section using the resources and supports offered during each session. Each participant will receive valuable resources to aid in their grant writing process, including a comprehensive checklist, guidelines on methodological and CV considerations, and more!

Research Facilitators from various colleges will be present, ready to address queries, brainstorm, or simply engage in productive conversations. We aim for each participant to leave every session with a clearer vision and a well-structured draft of their grant section.

These sessions will be offered to provide as much flexibility as possible for you and your research support team (i.e., trainees and research staff) as you progress on your grant-writing journey.

In total, there will be two sessions leading up to the final deadline on 02 February 2024. Here are the session details:

CFI-JELF Information Session

The Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) John R. Evans Leaders Fund (JELF) program provides institutions the opportunity to acquire infrastructure for leading research faculty to undertake cutting-edge research. USask has been provided a JELF institutional envelope from which project leaders can request up to 40% of the eligible project costs.

This information session to be held on **Tuesday, 04 March 2024 (2pm -3pm)** has been targeted for those interested in the **October 2025** CFI submission group. Institutional CFI ask guidelines and review process will be discussed and a timeline for the submission will be provided. Potential applicants and co-applicants are strongly encouraged to attend. Research facilitators and technical staff are welcome. We anticipate that USask will also submit JELFs to CFI in **February 2026** and **October 2026**.

October 2025 JELF Guidelines

- Proposed infrastructure will support cutting-edge CFI-eligible research at USask. It is appropriate to include in an existing or emerging core facility.
- Proposals can request up to \$800,000 from the CFI, with a maximum total eligible cost of \$2 million. The Institutional envelope is limited; the information session will provide **guidance regarding CFI asks** for this submission group.
- Core team (up to 3 applicants) must all have continuing, full-time academic appointments.
- Requests by OVPR to Innovation Saskatchewan will not be part of this call. Rather, proposals must demonstrate that **all matching funding** has been received by the university and/or provide letters of commitment from funding sources upon Expression of Interest submission.

Expressions of Interest intake will be **28 April 2025** and will be assessed for the fit with USask research priorities, impact to the USask research community, need for the infrastructure, feasibility and sustainability of the project and availability of institutional JELF envelope.

Mitacs BSI – Call for Applications

The <u>Mitacs Business Strategy Internship (BSI) program</u> is designed to facilitate Innovation in Canada with the help of post-secondary institutions and student talent.

- Companies and organizations leverage \$5,000 + GST into a \$10,000 internship unit or \$7,500 + GST into a \$15,000 internship unit to receive expertise from a student or recent graduate for a maximum of \$45,000 per year per student or recent graduate.
 - For projects with an Indigenous organization and/or an intern who is Indigenous, the contribution is only \$2,500 or \$3,750 per internship unit, respectively.

Each project requires supervision from a supervisor at the company organization as well as an academic supervisor to oversee the work and the student. All disciplines and sectors are eligible.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

CIHR Team Grants: Bringing Biology to Cancer Prevention

The **Team Grants: Bringing Biology to Cancer Prevention** aims to unite interdisciplinary research teams to advance the biological and mechanistic understanding of cancer etiology, genesis, and risk, linked with host, lifestyle, environmental, social, and other factors, to identify new targets and approaches for cancer prevention, risk reduction, and early detection. Collaborations between traditional cancer prevention researchers (e.g., population and public health researchers, epidemiologists, social scientists) and those from other disciplines (e.g., biologists, immunologists, geneticists, drug developers) or who are new to the field are strongly encouraged. Collectively, these research teams will develop and disseminate evidence-based solutions to enable improvements in cancer prevention, risk reduction, and early detection at the individual and/or population-level.

2025 KRESCENT Summer Studentship Competition

International Opportunities and Updates

Mitacs Globalink Research Award (GRA) Co-funding Stream – Last Quota Available for 2024/25 Fiscal Year

The <u>Mitacs Globalink Research Award (GRA)</u> is open to full-time senior undergraduate students, graduate students, and postdoctoral fellows. Successful applicants will receive a \$6,000 research award to conduct a 12-to 24-week research project under the joint supervision of a home and host professor, either coming to Canada from an eligible country or going to an eligible country from Canada.

There are two streams of Mitacs GRA Program:

- 1. International partner stream
 - Under this stream, projects that are being proposed with a Mitacs international partner do not require co-funding from the Canadian university.
 - The list of Mitacs international partners can be found <u>here</u>.
 - Under this stream, there is no limit on the number of applications submitted from USask.
- 2. Allocation stream (also called Co-funding stream)
 - Under this stream, projects that are being proposed without a Mitacs international partner require \$2,000 co-funding per award. At USask, this \$2,000 cash contribution needs to be provided by the faculty member who supervises outbound / inbound GRA student.
 - Under this stream, Mitacs allocated 7 quotas for USask in fiscal year 2024-25. **Currently, only one quota remains available.** This co-funding application is required to be finalized with signatures/institutional approval and submitted to Mitacs before 31 March 2025.

Eligible faculty members from all disciplines are welcome to apply.

- If your application falls under the Allocation stream (also called Co-funding stream), please notify the International Office at <u>international.office@usask.ca</u> as soon as possible. We will work with you to submit it to Mitacs GRA portal. (If your proposed project falls under the International Partner stream, this quota does not apply to your application.)
- Please note that with only one quota remaining, applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis.

Global Affairs Canada (GAC): Emerging Leaders in the Americas Program (ELAP); Canada-ASEAN Scholarships and Educational Exchanges for Development (SEED); Study in Canada Scholarships (SICS)

International Student Scholarship Programs (ELAP, SEED, and SiCS) funded through Global Affairs Canada (GAC) are accepting applications from international students for short-term study or research at a Canadian university. If you are interested in supporting a graduate student's application to one of these programs, please review the 'How to Apply' section and take note of the quotas in each program, as well as the deadlines <u>here</u>.

These International Visiting Research Student Scholarship Programs allow students to come to USask for a period of four to six months and provide scholarships ranging from approximately \$8,200 – \$12,700 CAD. Scholarship funds cover international student expenses such as visa and/or study/work permit fees; airfare for the scholarship recipient via the most direct and economical route; health insurance; living expenses, such as accommodation, utilities, and food; ground transportation, including a public transportation pass; and books and supplies required for the recipient's study or research, excluding computers and other equipment.

How to Apply (International Graduate Student Applications):

Preliminary Stage 1 – Preliminary Deadline: **24 January 2025**. The student applicant, in consultation with the USask host supervisor, must complete the respective '2025 Application Form' in its entirety and email it to the International Office (IO) at <u>international.office@usask.ca</u> as soon as possible and no later than January 24, 2025.

Invited and Submission Stage 2 – February & March 2025

The IO will provide an Invitation to Submit confirmation by email in February 2025. Only applicants invited to submit will move forward to full submission. No changes in the core application content (i.e., research project and activities, graduate student applicant or USask host supervisor) are permitted after an invitation to submit is issued. Invited applicants must then email the International Office the finalized application form, and all required supporting documents by March 8, 2025. The International Office will make the final submission on the applicants' behalf through our institutional portal by the funder deadline – likely in late March (the exact agency deadline to be announced by the funder). Applicants and their USask host supervisor will be notified once the submission is completed.

This new program offers early career researchers* to do their research for <u>1 to 12 months</u> in Japan with financial support. Under the partnership between NSERC and JSPS, you can apply to this fellowship via NSERC.

*Holding a doctorate received within the past 6 years or enrolled in a doctoral course and scheduled to receive a Ph.D. within 2 years

<u>Summer Program (2 months in summer) (Application Period: the middle of October to the end of November)</u>

This program gives graduate students and Ph.D. holders an opportunity to stay in Japan and do their research during summer vacation.

AMED-ASPIRE Program 2025 Joint Call with CIHR [Health Care] (Deadline: 19 June 2025 in Canada)

The ASPIRE programs operated by AMED and JST, aim to promote the international joint research and interaction between Japan and other advanced countries.

Kyungpook National University (KNU) announced the call for applications for <u>2025 Visiting Scholar Program</u> (<u>VSP</u>) for the summer semester. This program invites faculty members from universities worldwide to teach regular summer semester courses at KNU via live online instruction.

Program Overview

The Visiting Scholar Program offers international scholars the chance to deliver remote courses for students at Kyungpook National University in South Korea during the summer semester, fostering global educational exchange and enhancing students' exposure to international academic environments.

Subject Areas

Applicants are encouraged to teach in their area of expertise, provided it aligns with KNU's existing curriculum. In the application form, applicants must specify the course they intend to teach and provide a course description. Teaching Commitment (Remote Instruction)

- Course Load: Scholars will teach one 3-credit course (45 hours) over three weeks.
- Schedule: Classes are scheduled for 3 hours each, Monday through Friday (9:00–12:00 or 3:00–6:00). Mid-term and final exams will take place during the 3-week period.
- Platform: Teaching will be conducted via the KNU Learning Management System (LMS), which supports online lectures, assignments, quizzes, and attendance tracking. Detailed guidance on using the LMS will be provided to selected lecturers.
- Student Engagement: Scholars are encouraged to hold office hours to provide additional feedback and support to students.

Class Information

Applicants will be encouraged to use interactive teaching methods to KNU students. Given the short duration, KNU prefers that students are given handouts, instead of being required to purchase a textbook.

• N.B. In rare cases, a course may be cancelled due to insufficient student registration.

Financial Arrangement

KNU will provide a stipend of KRW 3.5 million (paid at the end of the course).

• Travel to Korea is not required.
