USask Workshops and Support Services

2027 Innovation Fund (IF) – Information Session

The [Canada Foundation for Innovation \(CFI\)](#) will announce the 2027 Innovation Fund (IF) program. The Innovation Fund aims to enhance infrastructure and personnel capacity, enabling researchers to stay at the forefront of exploration and knowledge creation. The CFI IF program supports the development of large-scale, distinctive, and advanced facilities that can boost future research in your field for many years.

Through this competition, CFI will invest up to approximately \$280 million in infrastructure and cover up to 40% of the project's eligible costs. CFI will also allocate up to roughly \$84 million for related operating and maintenance expenses through the Infrastructure Operating Fund (IOF). The most common eligible costs include renovation or construction expenses, research equipment, and personnel to support the development or use of the infrastructure.

RASI will hold an information session on October 29th, 2025, focused on developing competitive IF applications. The workshop will also explain USask's internal processes for distributing our CFI IF institutional funds and outline the support available for teams applying for this opportunity. Cross Disciplinary and Institutional Opportunities

Open Call Reminder: GlycoNet 2025 Research & Translational Funding

The [Canadian Glycomics Network \(GlycoNet\)](#) mobilizes Canada's glycomics expertise into transdisciplinary, focused research and development programs to deliver breakthrough solutions for human and animal health and sustainable agri-food systems. GlycoNet funds projects along the following research innovation continuum: translational research and development, clinical engagement, technology development, and knowledge mobilization.

Translational Grants

These grants seek to fund multidisciplinary projects with clear endpoints to **advance and de-risk** them to a state at which translation is possible, and could attract partners. Maximum request: \$150,000 for one year, 1:1.5 matching required.

Rolling Call. Review will be conducted on a **quarterly basis** until the funds are exhausted.

Next submission deadline: **15 October 2025** ([RASI Internal Deadline](#): 8 October 2025) for January review. For more details, see the [RFP](#) and the [LOI Template](#).

Strategic Initiatives

These grants fund **partner-led or initiated** projects designed to meet partners' needs. Maximum request: \$150,000 for one year, with possibility of renewal, 1:1.5 matching required.

Rolling Call. Review will be conducted on a **quarterly basis** until the funds are exhausted.

- “Matching Funds” means new, incremental contributions (of cash or in-kind) for Eligible SSF Costs, which would not exist in the absence of an SSF award (i.e. that can be directly attributed to SSF funding). Kickstart Program

This program seeks to support the creation of **new companies** (NewCo) as well as **existing start-ups** during their initial phase of development. Proposals may request up to \$100,000 in funding. Funding terms will be negotiated on a *case-by-case basis*. Matching funds and co-investments are preferable, but may not be required.

Rolling Call. Review will be conducted on a **quarterly basis** until the funds are exhausted. Note that this competition is in 3 steps, with the first step being to submit a business case (2-3 pages). For more details, see [RFP](#).

Regional Tariff Response Initiative (RTRI) in the Prairie provinces – Expression of Interest Call

The [Regional Tariff Response Initiative \(RTRI\)](#) is now accepting expression of interests (EOI).

If you are a business in the Prairie provinces affected by recent trade actions, the RTRI could be for you. It supports businesses looking to improve productivity, expand and diversify markets, strengthen supply chains, and boost domestic trade within Canada. Not-for-profit organizations that support small and medium-sized enterprises to manage the impact of trade disruptions are also eligible for funding.

Your project proposal must focus on boosting productivity, driving growth, and diversifying markets for businesses and sectors affected by recent tariffs or countermeasures. Examples of supported activities include:

- investing in digitization, automation, and technology to enhance productivity and competitiveness;
- developing and expanding markets to help businesses find new customers;
- optimizing global supply chain logistics and ensuring compliance with standards to gain market access and/or enhance sales;
- strengthening domestic supply chains and facilitating internal trade to increase the resilience and competitiveness of businesses and the reliability of domestic markets;
- reshoring production, research and development operations, and recruiting highly qualified personnel and expertise.

Deadline: You can apply to RTRI until 31 December 2027, or until all funding is committed. The application process has two steps:

1. **Expression of interest (EOI):** A short online form where you explain your project's purpose, eligibility, activities and budget. We use it to decide if your project should move to the next stage.
2. **Full application:** If selected, we will invite you to submit a detailed application through our online portal.

2026 SSHRC Partnership Grant - Stage 1 Funding Call

SSHRC Partnership Grants provide support for new and existing formal partnerships to advance research, research training and/or knowledge mobilization in the social sciences and humanities. This is done through mutual co-operation and sharing of intellectual leadership, as well as through resources as shown by cash and/or in-kind contributions. Partnership Grants are intended for large teams of postsecondary institutions and/or organizations of various types that work in formal collaboration.

Project Duration: 4 to 7 years

Funding Amount: \$2.5M

Stage 1 Application Deadline: February 2026

Stage 2 Application Deadline - by invitation only: October 2026

New funding opportunity: Artificial intelligence humanities sandpit

The **UK Research and Innovation's Arts and Humanities Research Council (AHRC)** invites researchers from Canada to submit expressions of interest to participate in a **humanities-led, interdisciplinary research "sandpit"** (a facilitated, collaborative process through which new research teams and project ideas are developed and selected for funding) with the aim of placing humanities insights and methodologies at the heart of artificial intelligence tech design.

As part of a collaboration agreement with AHRC, SSHRC is committed to financially supporting Canadian researchers who will take part in the work of the selected research teams. Through a series of workshops, teams would develop project ideas for further funding. Up to four grants will ultimately be awarded for up to \$200,000 over 18 months.

EOI Canadian applicants are additionally required to contact SSHRC prior to 30 October 2025 at partnerships@sshrc-crsh.gc.ca to signal their intention to submit an application.

Deadline for expressions of interest: 30 October 2025, 12:00 PM Eastern.

Funding Amount: Up to \$200,000 over 18 months

France Canada Research Funds 2026

The [France Canada Research Fund \(FCRF\)](#) 2026 call for proposals is open to any research field and incentivizes interdisciplinarity. The FCRF aims to accomplish the following objectives:

- Support the development of new research partnerships between France and Canada;
- Promote the advancement of research and innovation;
- Prepare and structure scientific cooperation between the two countries;
- Promote researchers' mobility, particularly for early career researchers;
- Provide research training for researchers at the master's and doctorate levels.

Eligibility:

- Applications must come from principal investigators (PIs), both from research institutions located in France and Canada.
- The FCRF endorses **new research collaboration** between PIs who have never obtained a research joint funding prior this application. Exceptions may be granted for researchers who previously collaborated during their PhD or during a post-doctoral contract.
- PIs must meet all the following criteria:
 - Must hold a tenure or a tenure track position;
 - FRANCE: Be affiliated with higher education institutions or public research organizations (please contact international.office@usask.ca to confirm whether your partner institution meets this eligibility criterion);
 - CANADA: Affiliated to one of the 23 Canadian universities who are members of the FCRF consortium, including USask.

Funding amount: CAD 8,000-15,000

If your application is pre-selected at USask, it will be submitted to the French Embassy in Canada before 19 December 2025 and you will be notified.
