The <u>CIHR Project Grant</u> program is designed to capture ideas with the greatest potential to advance health-related fundamental or applied knowledge, health research, health care, health systems, and/or health outcomes. If you are applying to the <u>CIHR Project Grant Fall 2025 Competition</u>, we would encourage you to participate in the Internal Review process. Your proposal will be forwarded to your suggested reviewers for their review and comments. This is an opportunity to get some early feedback on your proposal to ensure the strongest possible application.

Applicants considering putting a Project Grant Application in French

If you are applying for a <u>NSERC Discovery Grant (DG)</u> and/or a <u>Research Tools and Instruments Grant (RTI)</u> this year, we would encourage you to participate in the Internal Review program offered by OVPR.

Your proposal will be forwarded to your suggested reviewers, providing an opportunity to get valuable feedback on your grant application. In the event of an unsuccessful proposal, Internal Review of your DG application is one of the factors required to be eligible to apply for President's NSERC funding.

To be considered for funding, all project ideas must be submitted at the LOI stage. If new issues or opportunities arise after LOIs are due and warrant a rapid research response, Grain Farmers of Ontario will consider these on a case-by-case basis.

Researchers are invited to review the recently updated 2025 Research Priorities and to submit an LOI addressing those priorities using this year's LOI template by **Friday, 18 July 2025 (by 4:30 p.m.)**. LOIs submitted should have start dates of April 2026 or later.

International Opportunities and Updates

Internal Call for Applications: Innovation Saskatchewan Top-Up Funding for Eligible DAAD Programs and Germany-USask Partnership Building Activities

The Government of Saskatchewan's innovation agency and the DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) committed to supporting joint efforts to promote the international exchange of students and researchers and research and academic collaboration between the Saskatchewan and German universities and research institutions.

Through this initiative, the **Stream 1** top-up funding is offered to the students, faculty and post-docs at the University of Saskatchewan (USask) who have been successful in obtaining financing through one of the eligible DAAD programs (link) to cover/reimburse costs associated with DAAD program, but not covered by the award. **Faculty members are encouraged to consider supporting any postdocs they are working with to apply to eligible DAAD programs to support their research stay at USask or in Germany.**

Stream 2 of the funding may be applied toward joint initiatives with German partners, that do not require a successful DAAD program application. Eligible activities may include mutual delegation visits, alumni events, and other similar activities that will support increased engagement between the USask and German research community.

Eligibility

Eligible expenses include:

- Travel related expenses: airfare from Germany to/from SK; reasonable accommodation costs; meal per diems; ground transportation
- Research related expenses: direct costs; materials and supplies; project specific space rental; use of specialized equipment.
- Event related expenses: venue rental costs; catering (alcohol excluded); printing of signage or other similar materials

Priority Areas

The **priority areas** defined by Innovation Saskatchewan apply to both students and faculty and include:

1. **Health** (e.g., One Health)

- 2. Synchrotron sciences
- 3. **Digital technologies, industry, and space** (e.g., quantum computing, artificial intelligence)
- 4. Food security, bioeconomy, natural resources, agriculture, and environment/climate change
- 5. **Energy** (including nuclear, renewable, and alternative energy sources)

Indo-Pacific Scholarships and Fellowships for Canadians

The <u>IPSFC</u> will provide support to eligible Canadian post-secondary academic institutions, university consortia and research organizations to award scholarships and research fellowships to graduate students, academics and researchers at their institutions to study or undertake research in the Indo-Pacific Region.

The IPSFC program will:

- Enhance the study and research capacity of Canadians in areas related to the Indo-Pacific Strategy
- Increase connectivity between Canadian and Indo-Pacific institutions dedicated to research and education
- Support new research streams and academic pursuits in Canada on the Indo-Pacific region.

Study or research must be in line with the Strategic Objectives of Canada's Indo-Pacific Strategy, including topics such as:

- Regional diplomacy
- Regional political change
- National and regional security
- Trade and economic cooperation
- Technological innovation
- Sustainable development
- Climate change
- Natural (including marine) resources management.
- Applied scientific cooperation.

The International Office will form a committee with representatives from central and units to conduct an internal adjudication and select the applicant who will move forward with the full application. Each year, through the International Blueprint, USask invests funding to engage, advance and scale international initiatives with partners around the world.

International Travel Grants

Application deadline: 30 June 2025

 Global Ambassador Program (Incoming) – supports incoming international experts and faculty to the USask aligned with USask's existing or emerging areas of strength - valued up to \$5,000

- Global Ambassador Program (Outgoing) supports faculty and staff to travel to international universities and/or facilities aligned with USask's existing or emerging areas of strength valued up to \$5,000
- Internationalization Fund supports faculty and staff to increase the ability and confidence to initiate, build and support international and intercultural engagement and activities valued up to \$2,500
- International Travel Fund supports faculty and staff to participate in international partnership and capacity building toward the university's collective global citizenship and international community service engagement valued up to \$2,500

Cure Parkinson's: Quarterly Research Grant Funding Programme

The <u>CURE Parkinson's" Quarterly Research Grant Gunding Programme</u> funds preclinical and clinical research focused on slowing, stopping, or reversing Parkinson's. It does not fund research which is directed at symptomatic relief.

For preclinical research, CureParkinson's fund grants up to £250,000 (GBP) and prioritises projects that are likely to lead to clinical trials in people with Parkinson's within 5 years. For clinical research, CureParkinson's funds clinical trials and sub-studies of trials in people with Parkinson's. The grant amount is flexible but please contact the organization ahead of submission if you are thinking of applying for a clinical trial.

The Leakey Foundation: Research Grants

The <u>Leakey Foundation</u> is the leading nonprofit funder of research dedicated to understanding human origins. Each year, the Foundation awards approximately \$1,000,000 in grants and scholarships, advancing the mission to explore and explain the human story.

Leakey Foundation Research Grants support both PhD dissertation research and post-PhD research across multiple disciplines related to human origins, evolution, and behavior. The Foundation prioritizes funding for the exploratory phases of promising new research projects and innovative, multidisciplinary approaches that expand the boundaries of our current understanding.

The Foundation welcomes proposals from researchers at all stages of their careers, especially PhD candidates. If your research aligns with the Foundation's mission and you have an innovative or multidisciplinary project, you are encouraged to apply.

National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) Research Grants

NOCSAE's mission is to commission research, establish standards for athletic equipment and encourage the dissemination of research findings on sport injury and prevention.

Accordingly, the intent of the <u>NOCSAE grant programs</u> is to commission investigator-initiated research and to provide support for education, health, and safety research and development. The NOCSAE research plan proposed by the applicant must be related to NOCSAE's stated program interests.

NOCSAE invites all investigator-initiated proposals that address NOCSAE'S core mission.

Specific research topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Studies that inform existing helmet safety standards.
- The mechanical and biological mechanisms of injury and recovery.
- The application of developed tools and equipment for injury prevention.
- Studies related to the development of new equipment safety standards.
- Studies related to sport safety.

Korea International Water Week: World Water Challenge 2025 Call for Solutions

The World Water Challenge is an international contest hosted by the Ministry of Environment of Korea and organized by Korea Water Forum for water solutions. It was created as a special program of the Science and Technology Process in the 7th World Water Forum to identify imminent global water issues and to find feasible solutions based on the core value of "Implementation". Attracting great attention in the 1st edition in 2015 at the 7th World Water Forum, the program has become one of the symbolic platforms of implementation which has been followed up in the Korea International Water Week (KIWW). World Water Challenge 2025 is expected to serve its role as an important platform to share not only innovative scientific/ technological methods but also policies towards solving specified water problems around the world and to build a broad network among experts and stakeholders in the water sector as well as solution providers.

Up to 10 selected solution providers will be invited to the final round of the WWCH in Daegu, Korea. The final presentation and award ceremony will be held on 13-14 November 2025 during the KIWW 2025. 'THE BEST' prize winner will have a chance to speak at the WWCH 2026 the following year.

Prize amount: Approx. 7,050 USD for first place, 2,100 USD for second place, travel covered to attend the World Water Challenge event in Daegu, Korea.
